



Graduation and General Education Requirements

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

To earn a degree from Central Washington University, you must:

- Take UNIV 101 if entering with fewer than 45 credits*
- Complete a world language with 2 years of the same language in high school or one year of college-level world language*
- Complete a minimum of 180 credits, including:
 - 60 upper-division credits (300-400 level)
 - 45 credits earned at CWU
 - Earned cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher

*If you have a direct transfer agreement (DTA) associate degree, you've already completed UNIV 101, the language requirement, and your general education.

GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

To know which courses count toward general education, check out page two and your Academic Requirements Report in MyCWU.

I. ENGAGE: FIRST YEAR EXPERIENCE

Complete during first year

ACADEMIC WRITING I: You must complete the Directed Self-Placement before enrolling. You must earn a C- or higher in AWI before taking Academic Writing II (K1).

QUANTITATIVE REASONING: You must have an appropriate math placement before enrolling. Talk with your advisor.
