For students who are interested in applying social sciences to the business world and want to be grounded in a variety of perspectives, the IDS-Social Sciences Corporate World/Human Resources track might be a good option. This major allows students to examine how social sciences can add value to all facets of running successful businesses: leadership; day-to-day operations, such as finance and human resources; understanding consumers, markets and regulations; strategic planning and risk analysis; and others. Multiple disciplines inform this degree, such as psychology, economics, sociology, IDS, and political science. Students will be able to prepare themselves for a profession and graduate studies by completing this degree.

Program Objectives

Students will describe and apply various psychological and sociological theories to gain a deeper understanding of effective recruiting, onboarding, retaining, and development of employees.

Students will describe the role and value of four categories of diversity—internal, external, organizational, and worldview—within an organization.

Students will describe how various dimensions of employment-income, availability, growth opportunities—contribute to positive outcomes for individuals, families, and communities.
