Dr. Leslie Guelker-Cone

After working with public school and university students in California and Hawaii, Dr. Guelker-Cone came to Western Washington University, Bellingham in 1995, where she served as Professor of Music and Director of Choral Activities. At WWU, she conducted the Concert Choir and the Western Voices chamber ensemble and taught graduate and undergraduate courses in choral conducting and choral music education.

Under her direction, the choir performed at national and divisional conventions of ACDA, NAfME, and WMEA. International performance tours took the Concert Choir to many countries in Europe and South America. Former students hold choral conducting positions in schools and universities throughout the country.

Dr. Guelker-Cone received her Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the University of Colorado, Boulder in choral conducting and literature. She has served on national and regional boards for ACDA and NAFME and is a past president of Washington ACDA. She is in frequent demand as a choral clinician and honor choir conductor throughout the United States and Canada; recent international conducting projects have taken her to Thailand and Ecuador.

Ongoing research includes study of the incorporation of the movement theories of Dalcroze and Laban into the teaching of choral conducting, as well as the use of collaborative, student-inspired teaching techniques in the choral rehearsal. She is the author of the instructional video The Collaborative Choral Rehearsal: Inspiring Creative Musicianship, featuring the WWU Concert Choir. Dr. Guelker-Cone is a recipient of WWU's highest teaching honor, the Excellence in Teaching Award. She also received the Washington ACDA Leadership and Service Award and was inducted into the Washington Music Educators (WMEA) Hall of Fame; she recently received the 2023 University of Colorado Distinguished Choral Alumni Award.

Dr. Guelker-Cone retired from full-time teaching in June 2019 and was named Professor emerita at WWU; she continues to work with choral students of all ages both in person and online.

Retirement interests include traveling with husband Michael, enjoying granddaughter Evie, taking harp lessons, reading, catching up on films, attending jazz concerts, hiking, boating, and keeping in touch with friends and former students.



Dr. Wallace Long Jr.

Wallace H. Long, Jr., retired in Spring 2020 from his position as director of choral/vocal activities at Willamette University in Salem, Oregon, a position he had held since 1983. Dr. Long founded the Willamette Master Chorus in 1985 and was its director for the first thirteen years of its existence. Dr. Long sang professionally with Male Ensemble Northwest and has performed as a member of the Oregon Bach Festival Chorus, and the Festival Singers of the Robert Shaw Choral Institute. Groups under his direction have performed for state conferences of the Oregon Music Educators Association, Northwestern Regional Conventions for the American Choral Directors association, national conventions of the International Association of Jazz Educators, and the Music Educators National Conference.

In the summer of 2003 his Willamette University Chamber Choir participated in a performance tour of South Africa at the request of Archbishop Desmond Tutu. In May of 2006 he conducted a 250-voice choir and professional orchestra in a performance of the Haydn's Mass in the Time of War in Carnegie Hall. Several members of the Willamette Master Chorus and Chamber Choir joined him for this special performance. A frequent vocal/choral adjudicator, clinician and guest conductor, he is an active supporter of public school music in the northwest and has conducted honor choirs in Montana, Wyoming, Kansas, Oregon, Washington, Alaska, Texas, Ireland, and Thailand.



About CWU Choirs

University Chorale is the largest mixed choral ensemble at CWU open to all students without audition. Founded by Scott Peterson as a graduate teaching assistant in 1974, Chorale has become a destination ensemble for all students who love to sing regardless of major area of study. Prof. Vijay Singh has directed the Chorale since 1999 and emphasizes building musicianship, teaching vocal technique, commitment to excellence, and varied entertaining programming.

The CWU Wildcat Chorus is as ensemble for any CWU tenor and bass student who would like to sing. The "Wildcatters" are non-auditioned. They are an energetic group which fosters a team attitude and works to be a support group for the members as well. We generally sing a program of music styles taken from the traditions of the tenor/bass choral canon. The Wildcat Chorus has appeared at two Washington Music Educators Association conferences and at a NW Division Conference for the American Choral Directors Association in Seattle. This is "Dr. P's" eleventh year as director. He is also Artistic Director and Conductor of Canticus Vocal Ensemble.

Vox Divina creates beauty in community by performing music infused with expression to inspire the lives of all audience members. As a non-auditioned treble choir, our members range from brand-new singers to pre-service music education majors. We strive to bring breadth and depth of musical experience: the ensemble provides new singers with music literacy and a foundation of strong vocal technique, while music education majors receive leadership opportunities. The choir sings a variety of musical styles from cultures around the world and is under the leadership of CWU Director of Choirs, Dr. Nicole Lamartine.

The CWU Chamber Choir is the flagship choral ensemble at Central, representing excellence in vocal talent, musicianship, and professionalism. This SATB ensemble focuses on innovative programming - including premieres, commissions, and guest artists - to create a concert experience of exploration and intention. With a tradition of excellence spanning several decades, the CWU Chamber Choir is under the new conducting leadership of Director of Choirs, Dr. Nicole C. Lamartine. The members represent the highest level of singing musicians at Central, including vocal performance and music education students.

Exciting News for CWU Choirs

Prof. Vijay Singh is excited to announce that CWU's Vocal Jazz 1 has been selected to perform at the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA) Northwest Regional Conference January 26th, 2024 in Spokane, WA. Vocal Jazz 1 is recognized as one of the finest jazz vocal ensembles in the country and has consistently been invited and showcased at regional and national ACDA events during Prof. Singh's 24 year tenure at CWU. ACDA is the largest professional organization for choral music in the world and has one of the most rigorous audition procedures for performance selections. Directors must submit three consecutive years of live un-edited concert recordings for blind audition scrutiny and judging. Only the finest ensembles are chosen and invited! Prof. Singh and the Vocal Jazz 1 students are excited to share CWU's quality music program with the 6 state ACDA-NW membership and will premiere 3 brand new works at the conference!



Dr. La is excited to announce that the CWU Chamber Choir has been selected to perform (by blind audition) at the 2024 Washington Music Educators Association conference in Yakima in February, 2024. Lynn Dupin Award: given to the choir which is the most professional, tactful, polite, attentive, focused, and electronics-free. Choirs which qualify for this award will have been actively listening at the festival for the entire day.
