## **Director's Note**

#### Die Fledermaus Director's Note by Gayla Blaisdell

Die Fledermaus, sometimes called "The Revenge of the Bat" in English, was composed by the Waltz King, Johann Strauss II, and was premiered in 1874 in Vienna, Austria. The music of Die Fledermaus contains the perfect combination of beautiful Viennese waltzes and choruses with dramatic solo singing and lively duets and trios. The Viennese Waltz is a very recognizable and beloved musical style, and the CWU orchestra and singers, under the direction of Dr. Nikolas Caoile, honor the original musical style with their performance today. The libretto was originally written in German but was translated to English just two years after the Viennese premiere for its first performance in London. Even the Metropolitan Opera performs Die Fledermaus in English instead of German. It is one of the only operas that the Met has ever produced in a translation. American audiences have enjoyed Die Fledermaus in various English translations including the Met's famous translation by Jeremy Sams, but this production will feature a new adaptation and translation by Sarah Meyers written in 2016.

This translation/adaptation changes the setting from wealthy Vienna in the 1800s to upscale Manhattan in 2024 and features contemporary cultural references and modern sentiments. The juxtaposition of the Viennese Waltz musical style from the late 1800s alongside cultural references to social media, cosplay costumes, and American entertainment trends makes the story acceptable and relevant to a modern audience while they also discover the joy and lightness of this beloved style. Sarah Meyer's adaptation removes an outdated and harmful cultural reference to the Romani people and portrays the main relationship between Rosalinda and Eisenstein as a more equal partnership. The original plot of Die Fledermaus centers on a flirtation by Rosalinda with a past love and Eisenstein's intent to be unfaithful to his wife without ever delving very far into their motives, and their reconciliation at the end does not include any self-reflection from either character.

## **Director's Note Continued**

Sarah Meyer's translation takes a "Pride and Prejudice" approach to the relationship from the beginning by establishing a stronger personality for Rosalinda as a TV reality star and social media celebrity who is such a work-aholic that she has become distant from her partner. Eisenstein on the other hand, has developed a habit of "acting out" and playing the bad boy to get her attention but hasn't actually been honest with her about his feelings. Through the course of the practical joke that Falke plays on Eisenstein, the couple is confronted with the true state of their marriage and they learn something about each other and themselves through the story. We are still firmly in the make-believe world of operettas and rom-coms but the new translation raises Rosalinda's character to more of an equal with her husband and it does a better job of explaining the reason for Eisenstein's bad behavior which is not explored in the original. The students and I also struggled with the ableist characterization of the stuttering lawyer, Dr. Blind. We tried to think creatively about his character and came up with a new twist that re-invents the stutter into a completely different communication style. Lastly, this modern production of Die Fledermaus includes more diverse representations of gender and sexuality onstage in an effort to be more relatable and relevant to today's audience. I hope that the adaptations to the story and direction have reclaimed the dated story of Die Fledermaus for our modern audience so that a whole new generation of opera goers can enjoy the delightful music of Johann Strauss and this wonderful performance by the CWU students.

## Synopsis

## Act I

#### Eisenstein and Rosalinda's apartment in Manhattan

Rosalinda, a reality show star and social media celebrity and her assistant, Adele, are preparing for Rosalinda's husband, Eisenstein, to return from his court date. While waiting, Adele receives a text from her cousin, Ida, inviting her to a party being thrown by Prince Orlofsky, the wealthiest of the celebrity scene in NYC. Adele tries to convince her boss to let her off for the night when Alfred, an old flame of Rosalinda's, shows up and tries to seduce her. Eisenstein returns home fit to be tied because his lawyer bungled the case and got his sentence extended by three days. Rosalinda hides Alfred in her bedroom. Just then, Eisenstein and Rosalinda's old friend, Falke, arrives and manages to convince Eisenstein to delay his trip to prison by one night so that they can attend a fabulous cosplay party that evening. Then Falke separately arranges for Rosalinda to disguise herself and catch her cheating husband at the same party. After Adele, Falke, and Eisenstein leave for the night, Rosalinda and Alfred are interrupted by Deputy Tommy Frank who arrests "Eisenstein", who is really Alfred playing along with the ploy to gain points with Rosalinda.

## Act II

# Prince Orlofsky's party at a trendy event venue in New York City

Guests are gathering and showing off their costumes at Prince Orlofsky's party when Ida and Adele, now pretending to be an actress named, Eve, Eisenstein, Falke, Orlofsky and Frank all make their appearances in various costumes. The deception continues when Rosalinda enters disguised as a super hero and Eisenstein tries to seduce her in the "Watch Duet." Rosalinda manages to grab Eisenstein's watch during the party as proof of her husband's infidelity. Eisenstein and Frank realize the night is over and that they are both due at the prison (for different reasons) and hastily leave the party.

## Act III

#### Sheriff's Office

Alfred is still falsely imprisoned in the jail cell and Frosch, the night guard, is happy to be relieved by Deputy Frank who arrives late. Ida and Adele arrive and Adele confesses that she is not an actress yet, but that she wants to pursue her dream with Frank's help, only to find out that Frank is really a Deputy Sheriff and not a Film Director as he was pretending to be at the party. Rosalinda comes to free Alfred, but when Eisenstein also arrives to turn himself in for his prison sentence, Eisenstein disguises himself as Dr. Blind, the lawyer, and tries to trick Alfred and Rosalinda into admitting their affair. The couple finally open up about their feelings and realize that they have both behaved badly. Rosalinda and Eisenstein reconcile as the rest of the partygoers arrive with Falke and Orlofsky for the conclusion to the Revenge of the Bat prank.
