If you do not receive foundry10 grants, your application will be reviewed again for OUR grants. You will be notified via e-mail within three weeks after the application deadline.



If you are applying for either foundry10 grant or OUR grant, your application will be reviewed after Jan 31 due date. If you are applying for both Foundry 10 grant and OUR grant, your application will be reviewed after Jan 31 due date. If you do not receive foundry10 grants, your application will be reviewed again for OUR grants. You will receive your OUR grant application review result. (You will be notified via e-mail within 3 weeks after Jan 31 due date.) Present your work at the annual CWU SOURCE. Prepare and submit a report at the conclusion of your project summarizing the findings of your research and accomplishments of the project overall.
