All prospective SOURCE presenters are required to register their project(s) via the online "SOURCE Project Registration" form found on our webpage.

You must use the provided template for uploading your project abstract/artist statement/project description. You can download this template on our webpage or from within the registration form.

IMPORTANT: The information you submit in your Project Registration form will be published "as-is" in the SOURCE Proceedings. That means what you submit to OUR will be printed exactly as you typed it. Please ensure you carefully review your abstract and other registration materials with your mentor prior to submission so mistakes don't get published!


