MFA, Master of Arts or Ph.D.?

The **MFA** differs from the **Master of Arts** in that the MFA, while an academic program, centers around practice in the particular field, whereas programs leading to the **MA** are usually centered on the scholarly, academic, or critical study of the field.

The **MFA** is seen as a terminal degree, meaning that it is considered to be the highest degree in its field. In the interest of extending the connection between creative production and continued academic research, however, some universities have established competing **Ph.D**. programs in fields such as art history.
