

- Second-Year ASL (15 cr.)
 - Six (6) upper-division ASL courses + one required elective (35 cr.)
 - Capstone (2 cr.)
- Total: 52 credits

ASL Minor

- Second-Year ASL (15 cr.)
 - Three (3) upper-division ASL courses (15 cr.)
- Total: 30 credits

Summer Online Intensive Course

Nine (9) week summer session of ASL 151, 152, & 153 (15 cr. total). Each course is three (3) weeks long.
