

CWU Running Start Equivalency Chart

- Please be sure to meet with your high school counselor for final decisions on any class choice. This is for suggestion only and does not replace a quarterly meeting with an approval from your high school counselor.
- Remember, not every class is offered every quarter at each college. It is in your best interest to cover graduation requirements as soon as possible to make sure you do not miss an opportunity to take a class needed for graduation.
- Courses numbered 099 or below are not considered part of RS and will not be funded nor counted as college credit, however these course still count for high school credit.

Junior/Senior Year High School Subjects	College Equivalent
English	Any college level English course. Must be taken junior and senior year.
US History	HIST 143 or 144
Civics	POSC 210
Washington State History	HIST 301
Health	HED 101 or other health class as agreed on with high school counselor.
Math	Any math class student is eligible for per college requirements (must be over 100 level for RS funds to cover cost)
Science	Any science class student is eligible for per college requirements.
World Language	Any language class other than English
PE	Any PE class student is eligible for per college requirements. Please note this can also include dance classes as long as they are not being used for Art credit
Art	Any Art, Theater, or Music class student is eligible for per college requirements. Please note this can also include dance classes as long as they are not being used for PE class.
Occupational	Any Business, Computer, Information Technology, or other occupational class as agreed on with high school counselor.
Electives	Any class student is eligible for per college requirements that is not going to a specific high school requirement

College Credit	HS Credit
5	1.0
4	0.8
3	0.6
2	0.4
1	0.2

- There are three quarters per school year (Fall, Winter, Spring)
- Full time RS students are eligible for 15 tuition free credits per quarter
- The number of tuition free credits part time students are eligible for is dependent on the number of courses enrolled in at the high school.
