The Graduate Certificate in Rural and Community Health offers students the opportunity to pursue graduate-level study in public health with a focus on the determinants of health in rural settings and the resulting health outcomes in such communities. The program focuses on applied study to build skills in program planning and evaluation, health services administration and management, grant writing and leadership within agencies that serve rural communities and other underserved populations. Students completing the graduate certificate may seek career placement as community health workers, community health service managers and administrators, community health educators, grant writers, health promotion specialists, and related positions. This program is a new graduate study option, admitting its first cohort of students in Fall 2018.
