



GS* GLOBAL STUDIES

Synchronous Learning:

In **Week 12**, students gave their Global Challenge presentations. Each student gave a presentation using PowerPoint that summarized their topic and explained their interview results. This was followed by each student leading a discussion on their topic. This capstone presentation really showed how each student improved in their skills and confidence! The average presentation time for each student was 20 minutes! At the end of class, students shared what was impactful from the class and everyone mentioned how impressed they were with the interesting presentations and improvement. It was a great class!

"It was very interesting to listen to other people's presentations. I think other people's opinions are also interesting and can be used for future presentations."


Asynchronous Learning:

ADVANCED FUNCTIONS

Synchronous Learning:

In **Week 12**, WWU and CWU students came together once again to share class. In this final academic gathering, the students demonstrated their ability to use all the discussion skills from the cycle in a student-led discussion activity. Similar to the prior week in their individual AUAP Online classes, students prepared a discussion based on a reading of their own choosing. The articles were interesting and the discussions lively. The students discussed animal rescue efforts, global conservation concerns, COVID 19, and nuclear weapons, to name a few. Students did a fantastic job participating and everyone made authentic contributions to each discussion. Teachers were particularly impressed with the quieter students for whom larger discussions can be a challenge. These students worked very hard to share their opinions and they effectively asked for more details and were able to use follow-up questions and clarification language appropriately. A couple of confident students were able to successfully interrupt another student to ask a question, a skill that most students found very challenging. Based on the high level of student participation, it was evident that everyone took the assignment seriously by preparing and practicing in the prior week. It was a great class!



Teacher voice: In our final student-led discussions, a student from CWU managed to use every single discussion skill that we practiced during the cycle, and they engaged all participants in the class. It was impressive to see such bravery and determination from all the students as everyone was encouraged to share their opinion.

Asynchronous Learning:

Students completed a final exam on Canvas, the online learning management system, which covered all of the skills learned during the semester.





“Ensuring access to affordable, reliable, sustainable, and modern energy for all”
