

Major/Minor Admission Requirements

Admission into the Law and Justice department will be based upon overall grade point average (GPA). Students wishing to successfully apply for admission into the LAJ Department must:

1. **Have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.25.** Upon the recommendation of the Department Chair, the Department may admit a limited number of students with a GPA under 2.25. However, a minimum GPA of 2.25 in all LAJ coursework is required for a student to graduate with a B.A. degree.
2. **Be of sophomore or better class standing.** Many LAJ classes assume students have the knowledge and skills gained in the CWU-required General Education and Basic Breadth (GE/BB) classes taken during the freshman and sophomore years. Students accepted into the major or minor can enroll in 300-level LAJ classes before all GE/BB classes are completed, though we recommend otherwise; 400-level classes *require* completion of all GE/BB classes. A DTA (Direct Transfer Agreement associate's degree) qualifies as completion of all GE/BB classes.

Pre-Major

Students not yet eligible for the major (freshmen or sophomores still completing General Education/Basic Breadth requirements) may declare a Law and Justice pre-major. Enrolled pre-majors will be moved into the major program upon completion of the above admission requirements.

Standing Requirements

Once a student has been admitted to the program, that student must earn a **minimum grade of C-** in each course toward fulfilling major requirements.

The Department of Law and Justice reserves the right to modify these requirements in special cases or as the needs of the department change.
