BASIC SKILLS REQUIREMENTS

- a. UNIV 101 (1) or MUS 104 (3) at CWU if entering Central with fewer than 45 credits
- b. ENGL& 101 and either ENGL 103 or ENGL 104
- c. Mathematics: Either MATH& 107, MATH& 141, MATH& 142, MATH& 148 or MATH& 151
- d. Reasoning: PHIL& 106
- e. Foreign Language: 2 years high school or 1 year college
- f. Computing Fundamentals: BMT 120 or CS 101

BREADTH REQUIREMENTS

No more than one class from a single department may be counted within each of the three columns. In completing the nine (9) Breadth requirements students must complete four (4) writing content courses indicated by a **(W)** designation. All courses are 5 credits unless otherwise indicated.

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TRANSFER POLICIES

2011-2012

This summary of policies concerning transfer is based on the 2011-2012 Skagit Valley College catalog and the on-line 2011-2012 Central Washington University catalog <http://www.cwu.edu/~catalogs/>. This transfer policy guide is located at http://www.cwu.edu/~regi/equivalencies/college_list.html and is updated frequently with new information/course equivalencies.

TRANSFER OF CREDIT:

1. A maximum of 105 credits numbered 100 and above will be transferred, with the exception of: CSS 102-129; HSERV101-132, 143-248; PSYC 104; MATH 149; NMATH 100; WMATH 100; SOSC 111, 113, 120, 125, 132, 190; and **** 199. A complete list of non-transferable courses is available at http://www.cwu.edu/~regi/equivalencies/11_NON-TRANSFERABLE-COURSES.pdf. All students transferring from a 2-year school will be required to complete at least 75 quarter credits at a 4-year institution, with a minimum of 45 credits at CWU.
2. PASS/FAIL: A maximum of 15 credits of "Pass" graded courses (student option) may apply for graduation and be applied toward general electives.
3. FIELD EXPERIENCE: A maximum of 10 credits earned in field experience/cooperative education courses may be transferred from a community college.
4. DESIGNATED TRANSFER ASSOCIATE DEGREE: Students transferring with the **Associate in Arts University and College Transfer Degree (DTA)** or **Associate in Business (DTA)** will normally transfer in junior standing and automatically satisfy the Basic & Breadth Requirements at CWU. Students earning an AA degree after transferring to Central must complete the AA within one year or 45 credits after initial enrollment at CWU. Students transferring with the **Associate in Science Degree** will normally transfer in junior standing. Additional courses must be taken by the student at CWU to satisfy the general education requirements.
5. TRANSFER WITHOUT AA DEGREE: Students transferring without a transferable associate degree must fulfill the CWU general education requirements. Courses taken at Skagit Valley Community College are listed on the reverse side will transfer to that particular area. Courses followed by "(CWU)" are not available at the community college and can be taken after transfer to Central. *All courses taken to satisfy general education requirements must be taken for a letter grade.*

REQUIREMENTS FOR SPECIFIC DEGREE PROGRAMS:

1. BACHELOR OF ARTS FOREIGN LANGUAGE EXIT REQUIREMENT: Students seeking the Bachelor of Arts Degree must complete one year of college/university study of a single foreign language or two years of high school study of a single foreign language prior to graduation from Central.
1. BACHELOR'S DEGREE WITH TEACHER CERTIFICATION: Students who are pursuing teacher education certification may not apply grades of less than "C" in major, minor, required English Composition courses, or professional sequence, or grades of less than "C-" in Basic and Breadth Requirements.
3. COLLEGE OF BUSINESS: Intro to Business Law and Intro to Law are no longer accepted as a direct equivalency, regardless of the course number and when it was taken. Exceptions have been made by the College of Business based on curriculum and learner outcomes. Such exceptions will be noted on the following page.

Central Washington University accepts academic credits earned at other accredited collegiate institutions which are essentially equivalent in academic level and nature to work offered at CWU. Toward this end, the University endorses the Policy on Inter-college Transfer and Articulation Among Washington Public Colleges and Universities published by the Higher Education Coordinating Board. The policy deals with the rights and responsibilities of transfer students and the review and appeal process in transfer credit disputes.
