### I. Engage: First Year Experience

### II. Knowledge Areas

*Students are required to complete one course in each Knowledge Area. Of these eight courses, no more than two may be taken from the same department or interdisciplinary program. See the next page for course details.*

### III. Pathways

*Students are required to take at least three courses in at least one Pathway. Students can choose to take 5 or more courses in the same Pathway to earn a transcript milestone. See the next page for course details.*

### IV. Connect, Create, & Empathize: Culminating Experience

*Students are required to take one course during their junior or senior year.*
