- Funding Requests
  - i. English request- 2 people are going to Alaska to give a presentation of a paper. It is beneficial to us because it gives us a chance to practice. Chemistry would like a motion to approve \$600 to be given to English. Psychology seconded. All in favor:5 opposed:12. Abstintions:1. Motion Failed. Family Consumer Science motions for \$800 for English. in favor:7 opposed:4 abstintions:1. \$800 will be allocated English. PASSED
  - ii. Music (MENC)- Our club goes to a conference every year. It is in Yakima this year. There are 28 that want to be in reimbursed. We will be attending sessions

- and concerts. This concert will help us network. The money will be going to registration. Psychology would like to motion to pass for the full \$900. Seconded by Sociology. Abstentions: 5. PASSED for \$900 for Music.
- iii. Art- We are trying to attend the national conference in Philadelphia for three days three nights. The conference will be informational sessions, portfolio reviews, etc. We are asking for \$600 for four people. Psychology motions to approve for the full \$600 seconded by Sociology. Abstention: 1. PASSED for the full \$600.
- iv. Music Trumpet Club- We made finals for a conference in D.C. it is an amazing opportunity to compete with other schools. They are asking for \$500 a person from the undergrad program. Psychology motions to approve the full amount for \$900. Seconded by Biology. 5 abstentions. Motion carries for the full \$900.
- v. Traveling to WA D.C. to visit with Patty Murry as well as Maria Cantwell. How will they represent their departments on the trip? We will put it in a power point. Interdisciplinary Studies asks if there are some kind of guidelines pertaining to experiential learning. Megan reads under Article II requests for funds II.I item C The nature of the event must clearly be established to directly relate to the purpose of excelling in their academic career. Art says considering the amount is \$2,500. Our budget is limited. Sociology would like to point out they are within their guidelines. Marilyn wants to point out that if there is money left over then the budget will become lower if we do not use the money. Our budget will be at \$15,000 for the next three years.

  - i. Constitution and By-law amendments
    - 1. Constitution: 1-5.3.1: The SAS's Executive Board shall meet separately from the regular meetings twice a month during the fall, winter, and spring quarters, provided that school is in session, which will consist of 6 executive meetings in a single academic quarter. The SAS Chairperson shall set the meeting dates and times; one will be before the regular meeting and one will be after the regular meeting. The chair shall have the ability to cancel the Executive Board meeting after the General Senate meeting if there are no agenda items.
      - Biology motioned to be approved. Physics seconds. Favor: all.

    - 2. By-laws: Title VI, Article II, Section 2, Item B: Be a declared major with an academic department of representation or in the case of interdisciplinary programs, be a declared major of one of the represented academic programs, or in the case of the Educational Foundations & Curriculum department, be fully admitted to the teacher preparation program.
      - Interdisciplinary Studies motioned to approve. Seconded by Chemistry. Favor: all. Motion carries.
