Vic Savino—Lobby Day

The Office of Legislative Affairs in the ASCWU will be taking a group of students to Olympia to learn more about the legislative process and lobbying for four items on our school's agenda. It is on February 5<sup>th</sup>, and we will be leaving around 8am and returning around 5pm. Tonight is the last opportunity to sign up for it.

#### Chair Reports

Hauke: There is a Wellness fee increase proposal that we first heard about in November and they have finalized the proposal. Currently the \$11 Wellness Fee is not enough to keep the center running under current conditions. Mnimum wage has been going up 2% annually, and they have to rent out the SURC space they operate in. They have three staff and 7 student staff. If the \$15 fee proposal passed they would let go some of their staff but will be able to remain operational in the SURC. The ideal fee increase for the Wellness center would be the \$18 fee increase. They brought this forward to us to know if we, the ASCWU Student Government, would endorse the fee increase with Joey Bryant and Millissa Howard. Our conclusion as a board was that we should not be imposing fees onto students when cuts occur and other avenues of funding can still be pursued. (See ASCWU Student Government Resolution). I just got a memo that Ryan Anderson has sent to the Tuition Waiver Council. It is a monetary incentive for those in student government who participate and compensate them for their time.

**ETSC**: There is precedent for this around four years ago. An executive board member received a \$750 waiver, he was the only one to receive one.

**Hauke**: We had the Veteran's Memorial Meeting last week. Gregg Schlanger has designed this memorial for Spokane but was not accepted so we know have a design that we are looking to use for our memorial. This would cut down our costs greatly as we wouldn't have a designer fee and we would be keeping this project in house using campus resources. We polled the students on possible memorial locations and got our location by voting on it. We are in a central location in the state and we are hoping that it will be an attraction for everyone coming through Ellensburg to remember our veteran's. There are reasons that we did not choose the central campus location for reasons of accessibility. We want names of Washington's Veterans on this memorial. We do have names of those post 9/11 but we want to include our older Ellensburg population in our memorial. The memorial will be made of basalt pillars and those will need to be cut as soon as possible so we remain on schedule. The project proposed budget is around \$150,000. This is a very doable project for us to undertake.

We have drafted a statement to address the issues on campus that have been occurring.

Statement Concerning Religious and Cultural Intolerance towards Muslim Students By Hauke Harfst (Original statement by Dr. Geraldine O'Mahony)

"We, The Student Academic Senate of Central Washington University, hereby condemn under any circumstances the growing bigotry and xenophobia in our country, in particular the growing hostility that has been shown towards Muslim members in our community as a result of recent political discourse. As students of Central Washington University and residents of the United States of America, we must continue to uphold the standards and core values that this country was founded on, which include religious freedom, the celebration of diversity, and providing sanctuary for the oppressed. As a governing body of Central Washington University, we stand with our Muslim students, colleagues, friends, and family members and deem threats to the well-being of any members of our community unacceptable."
