- ii. Fall meetings scheduled
 - 1. Will be sending out the calendar invites for fall quarter meetings, in addition to sending them to get posted on the website.
- iii. Meeting with President Wohlpart
 - 1. If everyone can send me days and times that work for them, President Wohlpart would like to meet with us to discuss the closing of the equity office, and to connect with us all.

 - 1. We also will be scheduling a meeting with Joseph Pearson, the Director of Auxiliary regarding the CAP program, it seems like something went wrong, and it won't be initiated this year.

 - 1. I am working with Emilio to revamp our website, if anyone has any suggestions or ideas, please place them in the teams chat!
- vi. Board of Trustees ratification vote
 - 1. The constitution that has been sent to the BOT will need a complete ratification, as it was not done in the past. I have sent the documents to the BOT, and waiting for updates from Vero. I will be at the BOT meeting in person to help provide clarification
- vii. Meeting with President Wohlpart and Chief Jason
 - 1. I plan on scheduling a meeting with President Wohlpart and Chief Jason regarding concerns about ICE, and what systems are in place, and how we can work to communicate this to the student body.

- c. Senate Speaker
 - i. Faculty Concerns about DEI and Immigration Protocols
 - 1. Several professors have raised concerns regarding the future of DEI-related programs on campus, such as TRIO, the ESC, and other organizations. They are worried that current DEI policies may put these programs at risk.
 - 2. More forward, there has been some confusion and concern following the ICE protocol email sent from President Wolpart. The email provides general direction, many faculty members feel it lacked specifics. For example, they are unsure who exactly to contact in the event of an immigration related incident, and they don't know what actions to take in the classroom, such as whether doors should be shut or left open.



3. There is also uncertainty about how long the temporary protocols mentioned in the email will be in place, and what the more permanent or grounded process will look like in the future.
4. Some faculty have suggested creating a "Safety Red Card" protocol for both professors and students. This would be a simple, clear reference card with step-by-step instructions and important contact information. They believe this could help reduce confusion and ensure that both faculty and students are prepared in case of an emergency.
5. Overall, they want to clarify existing protocols, look into the possibility of a more formalized safety plan, and ensure that organizations for students stay.
