



Mission

The Wildcat Pantry works to empower CWU students by removing barriers to essential resources that support holistic well-being. We do this by creating centralized access to free groceries, essential items, resource navigation, and educational programming that addresses systemic issues.

The Numbers

Shoppers Registered

This year we partnered with PantrySoft to transform the Pantry into a shopping experience to reduce stigma around food pantries. With PantrySoft this spring quarter we registered 116 new shoppers.

Visits in the Pantry

Compared to the winter quarter of 2025, we have seen a 22% decrease in visits to the Pantry. Compared to spring quarter of 2024 we have seen around a 4% increase in visits in the Pantry.



The Comparison

Distribution

Our main goal is to provide nutritious food to CWU students. We have two metrics for tracking distribution we use the most. The “Quantity Distributed” which counts each item distributed and the “Weight Distributed” which counts an items weight in pounds.

This Spring Quarter the quantity distributed was 18753 items and the weight distributed was 9599.8 lbs. of food, household, and hygiene items.




