1. This document does not substitute meeting with your advisor. See the current Seattle Central Community College (SCCC) catalog for complete degree requirements.
2. Transfer to the Theatre Arts-General Studies program at CWU with the Seattle Central Community College Associate of Arts Direct Transfer Agreement (DTA). You can complete transfer equivalencies towards your bachelor's degree while completing the requirements for the DTA.
3. Students may transfer a maximum of 135 total credits from regionally accredited four-year universities, including a maximum of 105 credits from regionally accredited community colleges.

5. Work with an SCCC advisor to ensure proper course sequencing for the DTA and Theatre Arts-General Studies major.
6. Apply for admission to Central Washington University at www.cwu.edu/admissions. Visit your CWU advisor early in your academic career to find out if you are eligible for dual admission. Find application and guidelines at www.cwu.edu/admissions/dual-admission.
7. Include official or unofficial transcripts from ALL institutions you have attended. Once your DTA is posted, have an official copy of your final transcript sent to Admissions.
8. Students seeking a BA degree must complete one year of college/university study or two years of high school study of a single foreign language.
9. A cumulative GPA of 2.7 in the pre-admission requirement courses must be achieved with a minimum grade of C+ (2.3) in each course.
10. For students considering transferring after one year at Seattle Central Community College, these are general education courses suggested to be completed prior to entrance into the Theatre Arts program.
